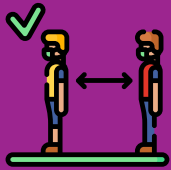
Campers must register for **one-week blocks**. You may register for more than one block.



Activities will happen **almost exclusively outside**.



Only campers & staff will be allowed on campus - no non-campers or family members.



All campers and staff must be **at least 6 feet apart** at all times.



All campers and staff must **wear a mask at all times**, unless eating or drinking in designated areas during designated times.



Campers will be part of **stable groups of 18 kids** or less and move throughout Summerhouse in one-way circuits throughout the day.



Campers and staff will **wash their hands before and after every activity**.



Shared surfaces and materials **will be cleaned after each cohort's use**.



Lunch will be packed by the campers' families and eaten safely outdoors.



Snacks will be provided individually by Summerhouse and safely eaten outdoors.
